WELCOME TO TRINITY EPISCOPAL CHURCH OF WEST PITTSTON

Located only minutes from Scranton and Wilkes-Barre in the residential "garden village" of West Pittston Borough, Trinity Episcopal Church is a friendly, kind community of faith where you are welcome. Established in 1883, we are a house of Christian prayer, worship and service for everyone, welcoming all who seek an inclusive community of friendship and love. In fact, living and building holy community is central to our parish mission efforts. In our gatherings for the celebration of Sunday Holy Eucharist, opportunities for ministry and service, and a wide array of community building events throughout the year we strive to mirror the relationship of love and abundance that exists between The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit. There are many ways to participate and belong here. We invite you to become part of the fabric of this community, and to join us in our commitment to live faithfully as members of the Family of God, "Working and Praying Together to Live and Build Holy Community."

WORSHIP IS THE CENTRAL ACT OF OUR LIFE TOGETHER

Worship is the central act of our life together and the Holy Eucharist is the heart of that life. Worship in the Episcopal Church tends to be quietly reverent and dignified. The Book of Common Prayer is the norm of our services. Our uniformity of worship, while allowing for variations, serves to remind us of the universal nature of the Church. In our worship we are united with past, present and future generations of Christians. Such worship is carried out with a view to the glorification of God, not for our entertainment; thus Episcopalians are not spectators but participants in worship. Not only do we express ourselves in word but also in gesture. Generally, we kneel to pray, we stand to praise, and we sit to be instructed. To Episcopalians, worship is the most important thing we do and ultimately this reality should characterize all that we do in every area of life. Following our time of worship we are sent into the world to be instruments of God's goodness, nurture and peace. Having received the gift of bread and drink from heaven we are sent to be bread and refreshment for one another and our world.

THE HOLY WATER FONT

The Font of Baptism is positioned at our entrance. It remains a symbol of our calling and mission. It is a sign and symbol providing the holy reminder of our celebrating our calling as God's daughters and sons. Utilizing the holy water of the font at the point of entering and exiting the church by making the holy sign of the cross is a way of recalling for ourselves and giving thanks to God for having been wonderfully made as a holy people set apart to serve as instruments and members of the Body of Christ. "Remember your Baptism. Live God's Love. Answer God's call."

COFFEE TIME / FELLOWSHIP. Trinity hosts what has traditionally been called "Coffee Hour" before Holy Eucharist on the third Sunday of each month, beginning at 10:15 a.m. This is an opportunity to gather before Mass to share fellowship and some light refreshments such as coffee, tea, juice, water and baked goods and fellowship with your Trinity family. Thank you to Jim Callahan and Marti Shafer-Callahan for volunteering for this parish ministry. To assist with baked good or bagels please check with Marti and Jim to schedule a food gift for this monthly meet and greet event.

CHURCH SCHOOL NEWS: at Church and at Home. With only a very brief and often sporadic time with youth on Sunday mornings we are reminded that Christian formation is something that mostly takes place between parents and their children in the home. This is why our Christian education efforts called God's People at Church and at Home focuses on brief Sunday lessons at Church and at Home focuses on brief Sunday lessons at Church and at Home resources designed for supporting parents who are always the first and often the best teachers of their children when it comes to sharing the Christian faith. Trinity Parish will hold age appropriate sessions every Sunday of every month beginning at 10:55 a.m. and also provide parents with ample age-appropriate resources for the week so that Christian formation can easily be scheduled around your family schedule.

A FAITH COMMITMENT TO OUR YOUTH. In an effort to provide youth with proper Christian formation and a faith foundation that will last a life time Trinity parish is hopeful that all parents with children will participate with the parish to make a commitment to provide regular encouragement for our youth to: (1) participate in church school on every Sunday of every month, (2) make new discoveries about their faith by utilizing their age-appropriate curriculum and Take-Home resources all through the month, (3) take time to pray every day, (4) participate in weekly Sunday Holy Eucharist, (5) volunteer and assist with the liturgical ministries on Youth Ministry Sunday (Family Sunday) scheduled on the last Sunday of every month (6) regularly share their talent and time in service to their Church and world, and (7) utilize Trinity's Lending Library [Must Reads For Young People]. NOTE TO PARENTS: Youth Ministry Sunday. Trinity Parish wishes to encourage our young people to experience ownership of the parish and discover their talents and have regular opportunity to be affirmed in ministry. Please review the Church School Bulletin Board located in the undercroft on a regular basis and register your child(ren) to volunteer and assist with the liturgical ministries on Youth Ministry Sunday scheduled on the last Sunday of every month. Please register with Church School teachers at least two weeks in advance of the date of Youth Ministry Sunday.

PREPARATIONS BEGIN FOR FIRST HOLY COMMUNION CELEBRATION WITH OUR YOUTH. Celebration of The Sacrament of First Holy Communion is open to all youth and families seeking this joyful and memorable event. Fr. Major has thoughtfully and prayerfully prepared an "age appropriate curriculum" for youth ages 5-8. The materials are for use at Church and at Home for autumn and Winter and our celebration is on Trinity Sunday, next Spring. Registration is required. Registration forms are located at the parish office and at the entrance of the church.

TRINITY'S LIBRARY. Trinity's Library is receiving a make over! The Library located in the church proper, is now mostly dedicated designated for our toddlers and young children compete with "GODLY PLAY" opportunities such as "toy blocks" to be handled with pictures of creation, Noah's Arcand the animals and Story Book of Noah, a child's altar complete with chalice and pretend bread, and a model of Trinity Episcopal Church complete with our youth own painted figures of themselves. Further, there are lots of resources to either sign out and return and soon... a file of handout lessons and projects to take home as part of our Christian education efforts called God's People at Clurch and at Home. The new home for our teen and adult library is still on one of the shelves in that area. Theses resources are the ones suggested by Fr. John for all teens and adults. If you have signed out books or are signing out books from Trinity's Library please follow directives as posted in the library areas and return within three (3) weeks. And... we have the library of the internet for lots more opportunities to be nurtured in our faith.
